**Village of Nassau Police Department
Monthly Report
November 2021**

Enclosed are the monthly reports for arrests, incidents, traffic tickets and auto accidents. There were 3 arrests, 41 incidents and 1 property damage auto accident investigated. A total of 35 traffic stops were conducted and 15 traffic tickets were issued.

Current Vehicle mileage:

Unit 602 - 2016 Ford Interceptor Utility – approximately 55,771 Miles

Unit 603 - 2020 Ford Interceptor Utility – approximately 9,463 Miles

Items of interest:

- 1) On 11/2/21 the Nassau Police responded to a Westbrook Dr. address for a Mental Health Complaint. Upon response and assessment, a juvenile was “arrested” under the Mental Health Law and transported to Samaritan Hospital for a mental health evaluation.
- 2) On 11/19/21 the Nassau Police responded to a Chatham St. address for a Mental Health Complaint. Upon response and assessment, a juvenile was “arrested” under the Mental Health Law and transported to Samaritan Hospital for a mental health evaluation.
- 3) There were 3 Penal Law Investigations (all Harassments) which were closed by investigation. There are 2 open Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC) law cases being investigated for the month of October.
- 4) On 11/24/21, Daniel Albertine was involved in a property damage auto accident (no injury) on McClellan Rd, where he struck a telephone pole causing it to break and fall which caused the top of a second pole to break and fall. Mr. Albertine was arrested for DWI, at the time of the accident he had his 9-month old child in the vehicle. He was further charged with Felony Aggravated DWI (Leandra’s Law). He was released on an appearance ticket per the Village Judge.
- 5) The monthly streetlight survey was completed and for the 3rd month in a row; all Village Street lights appear to be working properly.
- 6) Vacation watches were requested by 2 separate village residents. The Nassau Police completed a number of checks of each of the residential properties.
- 7) Officer Luis Martinez will be completing his field orientation during the month of December with hopes of having him on the schedule filling shifts in January 2022.
- 8) As was stated last month, there is an effort to get replacement body armor for Chief Colonno and Officer D. Bunney. We have changed vendors and will be working with Galls Uniforms in Albany. We do not currently have an account with Galls. Once we have an account we can proceed with our order.

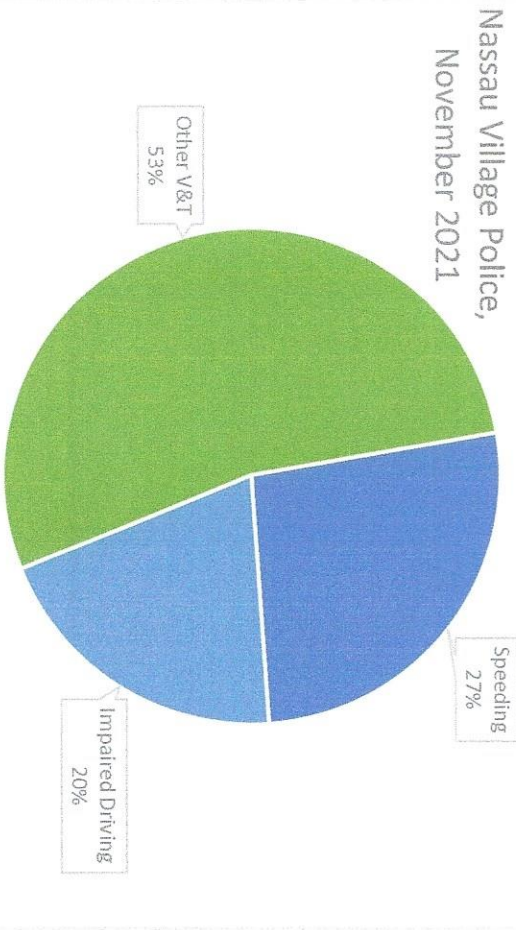

This local law is adopted pursuant to Cannabis Law § 131 which expressly authorizes the Village Board to adopt a local law requesting the Cannabis Control Board to prohibit the establishment of cannabis dispensary licenses within the jurisdiction of the Village of Nassau and is subject to a permissive referendum, the procedure of which is governed by Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Section 3.

Local Opt-Out

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Nassau hereby opts out of allowing cannabis dispensary sites from being established and operated within the jurisdiction of the Village of Nassau.

Section 4.

Severability
